Changes To Schools During The COVID Last Steps

As of late yesterday, Wednesday 25th November, some restrictions have been changed in relation to how our school may function. Below are the changes that directly effect our school:

- Parents may now enter the school site. We do ask that you do not remain any longer than necessary.
- Parents may now assist with Breakfast Club
- Drinking taps will be accessible for the students
- School assemblies can be held. These will commence again on Friday 4th December for our annual School Leaders (Grade 5) speeches.
- Grade 6 Graduation can have parents in attendance but we must comply with the numbers allowed on specific sites (eg. Red Cliffs football social rooms).

As a result of the changes we will be having 2 special assemblies on the 4th and the 11th of December. The first assembly will feature the Grade 5 students presenting their School Leader speeches for 2021. All parents are welcome to attend.

The second assembly is on the 11th December will be a modified version of our Barclay Square end of year presentation night. As we cannot run this night due to restrictions in public spaces, we will be presenting senior student awards and announcing the School Leaders for 2021 at this assembly. The class dances will be recorded on a USB device and sent home with the student's class certificates with their reports on the second last day of term. We understand that this is a watered down version of our usual event, but we must comply with restrictions.

We would love to see parents on site again but please remember that we must be vigilant and keep each other safe.

School plants seeds of space project

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THE science curriculum at Red Cliffs East Primary School is out of this world, with students look-

ing forward to experimenting with "space seeds" next year. The school is one of more than 150 around Australia to be Hading to all the selected as part of the What'll Happen to the Wattle? program, which is sending native golden wattle seeds to the International Space Station next month.

After living in space for six

months, the seeds will return to earth to be planted at the schools, along with seeds from the same seed lot that have

remained earthbound.
Prep teacher Jade Wright
said she and the students were delighted to be part of the

program.
"The kids were excited about having space seeds, and thought some aliens might grow or they might grow as high as the moon and things like that," she said. "We hope that the wattle seeds will eventually be planted

in the school yard and become a part of a map made of all the ace wattle trees around Aus-
