Dear Mr Warn,

I was so pleased to learn that you are celebrating your 100th anniversary this year. As Governor of Victoria, I wanted to write to congratulate you on this significant milestone.

As the Education State, Victoria has often been a trailblazer supported by the efforts of educators, parents and pupils of Victoria's state schools. The Education Act of 1872 made Victoria the first Australian colony to offer free, secular and compulsory education to all children aged 6 to 15 years.

There are very few schools in our State that have provided education for over a century. Across this time, much has altered – the curriculum taught by teachers, the quality of facilities and classrooms, and the diversity of the students within them.

What has remained constant is that access to education creates opportunity. It allows us to find new ways of understanding and responding to the world, even as that world changes around us.

It is interesting to imagine the times your school and its community have encountered. What is wonderful is to imagine what you, the students of Red Cliffs East Primary School, will live to see, experience and achieve with your education.

I send my warmest congratulations to all the teachers, parents and students of Red Cliffs East Primary School as you continue to create opportunities for generations to come.
